

The Rising Stars Youth Dressage Festival is committed to offer a competition where everyone is welcome, supported and encouraged to develop and grow.

#### Statement of Principles

Equestrian Canada (EC) the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all competition under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to: Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities; Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion and that they never subjected to mistreatment; Ensuring that owner's, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose; Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety as a matter of standard operation procedure; Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives; Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning Organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian Competitions; Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses. The Standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

It is the responsibility of the show/event committee, or organizers and the facility owners and managers to ensure that all BC Health Authority, viaSport and WorkSafeBC directives are followed and enforced. Please follow all vaccination requirements as dictated by your regional Health Authority. Horse Council BC is not a regulatory body and it is understood and agreed that sanctioning and approval of either a HCBC Provincial circuit event or Equestrian Canada Bronze or Silver competition relates to the use of the rule book and approved officials only.

This Competition is a Horse Council BC provincially sanctioned Competition and will be governed in accordance with the Horse Council BC Rule Book. Knowledge of the Rules is the responsibility of the Competitor.

The Horse Council BC Rule Book will be used and can be found at www.hcbc.ca.Neither Horse Council BC, its Board of Directors, organizing committee, staff, volunteers, officials, or employees of this horse show, will be responsible in any way, for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of exhibitors, spectators, owners, riders, trainers, or grooms. All competitors and owners of horses must be members of Horse Council BC to participate.

John MacPherson is an FEI competitor, EC Level 3 dressage coach and EC Senior Status Dressage Judge. His expertise in dressage and flatwork is immensely valuable to all levels of riders! John is a multi-year listed rider who has represented Canada Internationally for more than 25 years.



#### Provincial Ring & Super Nova Gloria Schriever Langley BC

Equitation & Repair Rep



Gloria is a professional Dressage rider and USDF Gold medalist with multiple winnings from young horse classes up to FEI Grand Prix. Having competed multiple horses in Germany, Canada and the United States Gloria's home base is GPI Dressage in Langley BC. Here she trains both her personal horses, select client's horses as well as coaches and mentors students through the levels of Dressage. In addition to her Equestrian endeavours Gloria also holds a Bachelor in Business Administration from Kwantlen Polytechnic University



Lezah Williamson is an 'A' Pony Club graduate who is also an EC licensed competition coach; she has just retired after ten years as National Education Chair for the Canadian Pony Club. As a junior, Lezah started dressage lessons with Olympic level coaches Peter Propfke and Inez Propfke-Credo, and later continued to fill in her dressage and equitation background with the help of trainers such as Jacquie Oldham, Leslie Reid and Cindy Ishoy (amongst others). Lezah's passion in her youth, however, was jumping, and she competed extensively in hunters, jumpers and specialized in equitation over fences (medals classes). Later she added eventing to the roster, and represented BC at Young Riders in eventing. However, the one constant thread in her competitive life has been the thrill of riding in the hack classes. Today, Lezah spends most of her time coaching in a wide variety of areas — dressage, equitation, hack, hunter, jumper, eventing and even mounted games, as well as helping to prepare riders for their Pony Club tests. One of her competitive highlights was coaching Canada's 16-25 dressage and jumping team in Hong Kong at the 2019 Inter-Pacific Exchange.

# HEALTH AND BIO SECURITY

#### **COVID-19 CONSIDERATIONS**

Rising Stars Youth Dressage Festival, hosted at Maple Ridge Equi-Sport Centre(MREC) will comply with applicable federal, provincial and local regulations, requirements and orders as well as WHO recommendations and British Columbia Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC) guidelines as they relate to mass gatherings, recreational facilities and sporting events.

Rising Stars Youth Dressage Festival will implement Equestrian Canada (EC), Horse Council British Columbia (HCBC) and other pertinent sanctioning-body requirements and practices for mitigating risk related to COVID-19 exposure and transmission.

How we will protect YOU

- Model and monitor social distancing.
- Refuse entry onto the property of any persons who present with symptoms of COVID-19 and/or have had potential or actual exposure to COVID-19 in the two-week period preceding the competition
- Ensure numbers on the property at any given time comply as determined by Public Health authorities as being acceptable at the time of competition
- Thorough and frequent cleaning of all commonly touched surfaces and items (gates, handles, etc.).
- Provide sanitizing stations/equipment throughout the venue
- Mark safe distancing in areas such as show office, washroom lines, catering, etc.
- Post reminders about safe distancing, minimizing transmission, and COVID-19 symptoms
- Time and schedule all warm-up and competition rides so that coaches and competitors are exposed to as few others as possible

The Rising Stars Youth Dressage Festival is sanctioned as a Gold competition of Equestrian Canada and is governed by the rules of EC." (A602.1) Equestrian Canada 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, ON Canada K1H 7X7

ARTICLE A519 VACCINATIONS All horses attending EC sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 and 4) vaccinations within six (6) months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the competition. No horse shall have received vaccination within seven (7) days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave event site at the discretion of competition management. The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. Competition management may request supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter must be provided with the entry form from a veterinarian, on official letterhead, stating the equine cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested

#### **Memberships**

- All riders, coaches, owners participating in the Gold Competition must hold the appropriate current License and or certification as required by EC
- All riders, handlers, grooms, coaches participating must hold current HCBC membership. All competitors'
  memberships will be verified online. US riders must include copies of their USDEF/USDF current membership
  cards
- Temporary EC Sport Licenses are available through the Show Office at a cost of \$73. (Cost subject to change).
- All Competitors in the Gold ring must hold current Dressage BC membership to be eligable for Championships and points. Foreign riders are exempt
- Horses competing in the Gold Ring are required to hold a current EC Horse Identification number. Foreign owners must sign an affidavit verifying ownership

#### **General Rules**

- Classes held in the Gold Ring will be judged and governed in accordance with current EC Rules. Knowledge of
  these rules are the responsibility of the competitor.EC Rules can be found at www.equestriancanada.ca.Any
  questions or concerns regarding these rules are to be directed to Competition Management to be addressed
  with the EC. Steward
- Dressage, Equitation and Hack Classes held in the Provincial Ring will be judged and governed in accordance with current HCBC Rules. Knowledge of these rules are the responsibility of the competitor. The HCBC rule book can be found at www.hcbc.ca.Any questions or concerns regarding these rules are to be directed to Competition Management to be discussed with the Provincial Rules Official
- As per EC Rules, any horse competing in the Gold Ring will be required to pay EC fees and on the recommendation of the EC Medication Control appointee may be subject to being selected for Equine Medication Control Testing

#### **General Rules**

- All riders must wear BSI, SEI or ASTM approved protective headgear, specifically designed for equestrian activities. The helmet should be properly fitted with safety harness correctly secured at all times, while mounted, riding or driving, with the exception of the discipline of vaulting. Every time, every ride, all riders/drivers. Youth competitors must wear properly fitted approved BSI or ASTM protective headgear, with safety harness correctly secured at all times while mounted on the competition or event grounds
- Competition numbers must be worn at all times when on the grounds
- Competition numbers must be clearly marked on your horse's stall door
- Competition back numbers must be worn in all hack classes
- Bridle numbers must be worn on both sides of the bridle
- Any horse entered in the competition may only be ridden by the competitor entered with that horse, staring from the time the horse arrives at the show grounds. (no trainers, coaches, parents etc. are permitted to ride a competitors horse from that point on for the duration of the show.)
- Lunging is permitted in designated area only. Lunge whips are permitted only when lunging. Horses must be under control at all times
- Walk Trot and Training level tests ridden in the Provincial ring MAY be held in a 20 x 40 meter ring. All other
  test levels will be held in a 20 x 60 ring
- EC Dressage Tests will be used in the Gold Ring. EC Dressage Tests, WDAA Western Dressage Tests tests will be used in the Provincial Ring
- After the bell has rung ,the rider will be given 45 seconds to enter at "A"
- Callers are allowed ,Exception: FEI Divisions and Championship Classes, callers are not permitted in these classes. Competitors must provide their own callers. Callers are to be dressed in a smart, casual manner as per EC Article 9.1.3. Inappropriately dressed callers may not be permitted to call a test. (i.e. tank tops ,cut offs flip flops etc
- Whips may be carried, but must not exceed 1.2 meters (including the lash). The maximum whip length for ponies is one (1) meter. Exception: Whips are not permitted in Championship Classes
- Tack checks are mandatory after each test
- Dogs must be leashed and under control at all times. No dogs are to be left unattended or tied to stall doors.
   Owners may be fined for leaving dogs unattended or letting them run loose
- Competition Management reserves the right to limit the number of entries and /or refuse an entry, adjust ,split or cancel classes or awards or make decisions on any matter not governed in the HCBC or EC Rule Books
- Decisions made by management and officials are final
- Stallions ridden by Juniors are required to be accompanied by a competent adult handler/person responsible.
   Decisions to the manageability of stallions are at the discretion of the Judges, Steward and Show Management
   Stallions deemed unsafe or unmanageable will be excused from the competition and asked to leave the grounds
- Neither the Rising Stars Youth Dressage Committee nor the Rising Stars Youth Dressage Festival Show
   Committee may be held responsible in any way for damages ,injury or loss to person ,horse or property
- SAFE SPORT When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance Article 102, Safe Sport Environments

#### Entries Close Friday August 4 @ 5:00 pm

**Per Article A801**, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition

#### **General Rules**

- Each horse is limited to a maximum of 4 tests per day. Equitation, hack and or miscellaneous classes are not included in this number
- No cross entry within FEI classes
- No cross entry between walk/trot and canter classes
- No gate holds
- Hack classes may be split and judged by age divisions
- FEI Ponies must provide an EC measurement card
- No Dressage Test cross entry between Gold and Provincial Rings

#### Age and Division Specs: Ages are as of Dec 31 2023,

(exception BC Summer Games Qualifying Division)

- JUNIOR The junior (Jr) category in EC classes at Gold competitions is open to all athletes until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18
- FEI AGE LIMITATIONS, please see EC Rule Book ARTICLE E 3.4.4 for the specifications on age limits only applying to athletes competing in FEI Children, FEI Pony, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes
- PARA EQUESTRIAN DIVISION: Open to riders holding a classification certificate
- RISING STARS EQUITATION DIVISION: Open to riders 21 years and under as of Dec 31 2023. The Rising Stars Equitation Division was created to spotlight the importance of equitation and it's influence and effect on the rider and the performance of the horse. Two judges will judge the same test. One judge will judge the technical aspect of the test and one judge will judge only the equitation of the rider. The scores from the equitation Judge will determine the top two equitation riders from each age category in each level. All qualified riders will compete together in one championship equitation class with the top two from that class riding off to determine the Champion and Reserve Champion Equitation Rider of the show.
- SUPER NOVA DIVISION: Over 21 years old to infinity and beyond as of Dec 31 2023
- 2024 BC SUMMER GAMES PARA EQUESTRIAN QUALIFYING DIVISION: Athletes must be a minimum of 13 years of age and a maximum of 30 years of age as of Dec 31 2022. Walk: Grade 1 Walk/Trot: Grade 2 Walk/Trot/Canter: Grade 4
- 2024 BC SUMMER GAMES QUALIFYING DIVISION: Athletes must be a minimum of 13 years of age and a maximum of 18 years of age as of Dec 31 2022

#### Entries Close Friday August 4 @ 5:00 pm

#### **Entries**

- Entries received after the closing deadline will be subject to a late entry fee of \$40.00.
- Day of post entries may be accepted, schedule permitting and at the approval of the Competition Manager. An additional post entry fee of \$10.00 will be charged and must be paid in cash before entry will be accepted into the class.
- The Competition Office will be open Thursday August 17 from 12:00pm 7:00pm.
- On the days of competition the office will open @ 7:00am
- Entries may be received by snail mail or email
- Entries changed after they have been received will be subject to an additional \$10.00 change fee
- One horse /rider entry per entry form
- Entries may be paid by Cheque or E Transfer and must be received by closing date
- A \$50.00 NSF Fee will be charged on any returned entry Fees. Any NSF Fees or outstanding fees must be paid
  in cash before competition numbers will be released. The Entry Secretary will try to notify any entry with a
  balance owing, competitors with outstanding amounts will be expected to pay the outstanding amounts in cash,
  exact change only
- Cheques or E Transfers received after the closing deadline may not be accepted and the entry rejected
- Waivers must be signed by all competitors and or parents of a minor competitor. No competitor will be permitted to ride on the grounds without signing a waiver
- Within one week upon receipt of entry, an email will be sent to confirm receipt.
- Ride times will be emailed to all competitors on or before Tuesday August 15 and will also be posted at the Competition Office .It is the responsibility of the competitor to check day sheets incase of changes to the schedule
- If a competitor is competing on more than one horse in a class, they are asked to indicate the preferred order of ride times. Competition management will make every effort to try and accommodate requests
- Ride Times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times or to facilitate the schedule
- Entries will be time stamped upon receipt. In the event that a class is full, entries received before the closing deadline will be placed on a waitlist in the order they were received. If the entry does not wish to be placed on the waitlist ,or do not get into the competition, they will be refunded their entry fees in full
- Entries withdrawn before the closing date will have paid fees refunded in full
- Entries withdrawn after the closing date will have 50% of class fees refunded when accompanied by a vet cert or doctors note. Vet cert or doctors' note must be received by the entry secretary no later than 7:00pm Thursday August 17 in order to receive refund. Any stabling ,admin or EC fees will not be refunded
- **Substitution** of horse and or rider will only be permitted with the following documentation and must be accompanied by a substitution fee of \$25.00

Horse: Vet cert, bill of sale or notice of termination of lease

Rider: Signed Doctors' note

- Substitutions must be made by 5:00pm Thursday August 17
- The show office must be advised of any scratches

#### **Stabling**

- Stabling for the competition horses will be in permanent stalls. Cost of stalls is \$185.00 for 3 nights. Stalls may be occupied from 12 noon Thursday, August 17, to 7pm Sunday, August 20, 2023. Sawdust bedding is included. Competitors wishing to arrive early must confirm arrival dates and ETA directly with show manager prior to arrival. Additional stabling fee of \$65.00 per day will apply for horses arriving prior to Thursday at 12 noon
- A stall clean out deposit of \$75.00 per stall will be required. Please include a separate cheque for the Stall Clean out deposit with your entries or provide one at check in, numbers will not be released without. Stall clean out deposit cheques are to be made payable to Pony Palooza Horse Show Management. Stall clean out cheques will be returned when confirmed with the show office that the stall has been stripped and swept. Once the stall has been broom-swept clean upon departure (including all hay, garbage, etc.) and the horse show office has been notified, the Stall Clean Out Deposit will be returned. There will be no stall clean out fee refund if the horse show office has not been notified
- To ensure stabling with a group, please include the barn/stable/group name on your entry
- Manure disposal is onsite, please manure only do not put garbage in the manure bunker
- Tack stalls may be limited if required for stabling and will be will be available on a first come first serve basis. Tack stalls will be charged the same as the show stalls
- Haul ins will be permitted at a cost of \$35.00 per day

#### Camping

- RV parking/Camping is available in a designated area No hook-up or water. Showers and bathrooms available onsite for those camping.
- RV Parking/camping must be pre booked on your entry form
- RV Parking / Camping cost is \$50.00 for the Competition

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS AWARDS

#### **Awards**

- Dressage, Hack and Miscellaneous classes :awarded rosette ribbons 1st place to 6th place
- Equitation classes: awarded rosette ribbons 1st place to 8th place
- Prizes will be awarded to all first place winners
- Dressage Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded for all levels in Dressage classes.
- Champion and Reserve Champion will be determined by the total percentage from two (2) Champion (C) designated classes for Intro, Training through Fourth Level in Gold and Provincial rings. (highest combined percentages)
- Champion and Reserve Champion FEI will be determined by percentages from Team and Individual tests
- Champions will be presented Saturday evening during the Parade of Champions. Winners must be mounted and in full dress to receive their awards. Failure to show as required will result in forfeiture of of the award and will be presented to the next next highest placing
- Hack Championship and Reserve Championship will be awarded for each Hack Division and will be determined by accumulation of points
- **Points** as follows:1st place 7 points,2nd place 5 points,3rd place 4 points,4th place 3 points,5th place 2 points,6th place 1 point
- Overall Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded as horse/rider combinations accumulating top scores from two (2) Championship (C) designated Technical Dressage tests in Walk Trot ,First to fourth Levels or two (2) Championship (C) designated FEI tests ,plus Dressage Seat Equitation and two Hack classes
- 10 extra points will also be awarded towards Overall Championship and Reserve Championship to riders who attend all education sessions
- Overall Show Champion and Reserve Champion awards will be presented at the end of competition Sunday afternoon. Winners must be present ,mounted and in full dress

#### Match your score with the judges score

- Riders competing in any test 2 from any level on Saturday will have a chance to guess their score and see how close they are to the judge's score
- At the completion of the test ,riders are to see the Steward or Rules official (Provincial Ring) for tack check. A score recorder will be present. Riders wishing to participate will tell the score recorder what they think they scored. Scores will be compared with the judges scores at the end of the day .Rider who guesses closest will win a prize. Scores may be given up to two decimal points (i.e. 65.54%)

#### Miscellaneous Classes

**Hack Division:** The purpose of the hack division is to show the versatility of a horse or pony on the flat. The well-rounded hack horse or pony shows the versatility to perform well and adjust his way of going in each of these classes. Horses or ponies in this division may be any breed or combination of breeds, and must have natural action (i.e. not high and/or weighted).

The hack division is an open division but will be split if entries warrant.

#### Show Hack

To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop; collected and extended gaits to be called for; To stand quietly; only 8 horses to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on 55% performance, 20% quality, 15% conformation and 10% manners

#### Road Hack

To be shown at a flat-footed walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Only 8 horses to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on 55% performance, 20% substance, 15% conformation and 10% manners

#### **English Pleasure**

To be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter; not to gallop; light contact to be maintained. To be judged on 45% performance, 40% manners and 15% conformation

#### **Hunter Hack**

The class will be judged on style over fences, flat work, manners, and way of going. May be asked to hand gallop. Will be required to jump a line of two fences not to exceed 2' in height

#### **Dressage Seat Equitation**

Rider equitation (position, seat, and correctness and effectiveness of the aids as required by training and first level tests. Whips and spurs are allowed, horses must wear a snaffle bit. Medium walk, trot, and canter. The judge may ask riders to perform individual tests or movements

#### Ride a Fiver

All riders in the class will enter the arena bareback, a five dollar bill (\$5.00)will be placed under one leg. The announcer will then call out different requests of various speeds, turns and tasks. The Rider who keeps the bill under their leg the longest will place first and keep all of the money Riders may wear costumes

#### Costume Class

Riders and horses may wear costumes. Class to be judged on presentation and creativity

#### Prix Caprilli Prix Caprilli Test I (No canter – trot poles)

The Prix Caprilli test provides an opportunity for the horse and rider to demonstrate elementary skills in dressage and jumping. It is understood that in the working gaits, a jumping horse is not expected to be as on the bit (round) as a competing dressage horse. The horse must softly accept the bit and may show more roundness in the parts of the test separate from the jumps. Trot work to be done posting. Transitions into and out of the halt may be through the walk. Test may be called. Refusals will be penalized as an error of course. Knockdowns will be penalized at the judge's discretion. In the case of a knocked down rail being in the way, the judge will ring the bell for the rider to stop without penalty. After the jump is replaced, the bell will be rung again telling the rider to continue from where they stop

#### Prix Caprilli Test 2 (Canter & 2ft max. Jump)

Prix Caprilli Test #2 - For horses with jumping experience showing Training Level Dressage or above - maximum height of fences 2 feet. It is understood that in the working gaits, a jumping horse is not expected to be as round on the bit as a competing Dressage horse. The horse must softly accept the bit and may show more "roundness" in the parts of the tests separate from the jumps. Trot work to be done posting. Transitions into and out of the halt may be through the walk. Test may be called. Refusals will be penalized as an error of course. Knockdowns will be penalized at the judge's discretion. In the case of a knocked down rail being in the way, the judge will ring the bell for the rider to stop without penalty. After the jump is replaced, the bell will be rung again telling the rider to continue from where they stopped


